Judging by the fun-filled activities, donations, and mentorship sessions we carried out with the girls, we can say that we sure did Keep Girls in School!

Through the mentorship sessions, we created awareness around menstrual health and period education. We also indulged the girls in creative activities, such as acting, dancing, and singing; to create awareness.

Food security is an essential aspect of any long-term project. With a keen understanding of this, we helped the girls' plant vegetables in their kitchen garden. We also educated them on the vitality and need for the kitchen garden in the present and the future.

Lastly, bearing in mind the current drastic climatic changes and the semi-arid condition of Kajiado, we saw a need to plant trees. In line with this, we planted over 200 trees around the school and the church where the girls are hosted. We also distributed some tree seedlings to the community members and taught them how to plant and care for the tree seedlings.
